# Dixie West Post Fire Recovery #8GG22628 CEQA Cooperative Agreement Between Honey Lake Valley Resource Conservation District & W. M. Beaty & Associates, Inc.

September 28, 2023

#### **Project Identification:**

This agreement is for the Honey Lake Valley Resource Conservation District (HLVRCD) to serve as the lead agency, in accordance with CEQA Guidelines Section 15051 (b) (1), for the proposed W. M. Beaty & Associates, Inc. (W.M. Beaty) Dixie West Post Fire Recovery #8GG22628.

#### **HLVRCD and Beaty Responsibilities:**

Beaty will prepare the necessary documentation for meeting the goal of full compliance under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and all CEQA process documentation for the Dixie West Post Fire Recovery Project. HLVRCD will review, organize, file and adopt all necessary documentation in compliance with CEQA Guidelines. All products will be delivered in accordance with the attached Standard Clauses (Exhibit A).

#### **Duration of Contract:**

The duration of this Contract will extend from September 28, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

#### **Project Managers:**

The project manager for W.M. Beaty & Associates, Inc. is Ryan Hilburn. Project manager for the HLVRCD is Kelsey Siemer.

#### **Method of Payment:**

Payment will be for CEQA County Clerk Processing fee of \$50 plus \$2,500 for RCD staff time, not to exceed \$2,550.

### Standard Clauses Exhibit A

### Worker's Compensation Clause

Vendor agrees to comply with provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that Code, before commencing the performance of the work under this Contract. W.M. Beaty will make its contractors and subcontractors aware of this provision and determine that they have complied with it before commencing work on the project. Volunteer laborers are exempt from the worker's compensation provision of the California Labor Code.

#### National Labor Relations Board Clause

In accordance with Public Contract Code Section 10296, W.M. Beaty declares under penalty of perjury that no more than one final, unappealable finding of contempt of court by a federal court has been issued against the W.M. Beaty within the immediately preceding two-year period because of W.M. Beaty 's failure to comply with an order of a federal court which orders W.M. Beaty to comply with an order of the National Labor Relations Board.

#### Nondiscrimination Clause

During the performance of this Contract, W.M. Beaty, its contractors, and subcontractors shall not deny the Contract's benefit to any person on the basis of religion, color, ethnic group identification, sex, age, physical or mental disability, nor shall they discriminate unlawfully against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, age (over 40), or sex. W.M. Beaty shall insure that the evaluation and treatment of employees and applicants for employment are free of such discrimination. W.M. Beaty , its contractor, and subcontractor shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code Section 12900 et seq.) and the regulations promulgated thereunder (California Administrative Code, Title 2 Sections 7285.0 et seq.), the provisions of Article 9.5, Chapter 1, Part 1, Division 3, Title 2 of the Government Code (Government Code Section 11135-11139.5), and the regulations or standards adopted by the awarding State agency to implement such article.

W.M. Beaty, its contractors, and subcontractors shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other agreement.

W.M. Beaty shall include the nondiscrimination and compliance provision of this clause in all subcontracts to perform work under the Contract.

W.M. Beaty, its contractors, and subcontractors shall permit access by representatives of the Department of Fair Employment and Housing and the awarding State agency, upon reasonable notice, at any time during the normal business hours, but in no case less than 24 hours notice, to such of its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as said Department or Agency shall require to ascertain compliance with this clause. The W.M. Beaty 's signature on this contract shall constitute a certification under the penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the W.M. Beaty has, unless exempted, complied with the nondiscrimination program requirements of Government Code Section 12990 and Title 2, California Code of Regulations Section 8103.

#### Hold Harmless

The Vendor and Landowner agree to mutually save harmless, Landowners and Vendor, their agents or employees and to hold the same free and harmless from any and all claims, demands, damages, losses, costs, expenses or liability due or incident to, either in whole or in part, and whether directly or indirectly, related to the project resulting from any and all contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, laborers and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work, services, materials or supplies in connection with the performance of this contract, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by the Landowner or Vendor in the performance of this contract, except all claims due to willful negligence or fraud. The hold harmless damages shall include damages from floods, fires or other Acts of Nature, as well as, any upstream or downstream effects.

#### Successors and Assigns

This Contract and all of its provisions shall apply to and bind the successors and assigns of the parties hereto. #### Audit Requirement

The project footprint is within Lassen County and will conduct post fire recovery work on approximately 4,958 acres of privately owned timberland within portions of the North Fork of the Feather River watershed (specifically within portions of the Hamilton Branch, Jennie Creek, Lower Robbers Creek, Star Lake, and Upper Robbers Creek Planning Watersheds). Work will include site preparation, pre-planting treatment of competing vegetation, sowing and planting of seedlings, and planting of native plant seed for habitat improvement. The target condition for the treated areas is to have well stocked forests established that are resilient to future natural disturbances such as wildfire, endemic and exotic pests, drought, and increased temperatures.

Project Location - City: Westwood, CA Project Location - County: Lassen County

Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:

CAL FIRE would provide funding to expedite priority restoration measures in high severity burn areas on approximately 4,958 acres of privately owned timberland (owned by RRF Westwood LLC and managed by W. M. Beaty & Associates) within proximity to the community of Westwood. Funding supports the broader goal to reforest approximately 18,000 acres burn at a high severity in the Dixie Fire footprint. Funding provided through the Forest Health Program will focus entirely on dead tree removal in the form of chips (66,915 tons), herbicide application, purchase and planting of seedlings, and native plant seeding. The project supports a year-round local workforce, enabling continued operations of wood processing facilities, while improving forest health, watershed conditions, and reducing fuel loads near the communities of Westwood and Clear Creek.
